

Addendum 2 Vendor Responses

Alabama Community
College System

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1. In reviewing Appendix D Institution Information, there are four Alabama community colleges missing; Lurleen B. Wallace, Wallace Dothan, Wallace Selma and Wallace Hanceville. Are these colleges not part of this bid? If they are, please provide the details for these colleges.

Response: These colleges were inadvertently left off. They are part of the bid. See tables at the end of this document.

2. Can ACCS quantify the existing systems (provided in Appendix B) that are in use across the system? (How many schools are using each solution in the system?)

Response: As stated in Appendix B of the RFP, the “desire is to decommission as many third-party systems as reasonable, and/or consolidate variations where a single third-party is most advantageous.” Those ultimately targeted for consolidation/standardization, or replacement will depend on what the vendor solutions deliver, so the vendors can consider any of these. A logical suite may be Reporting Tools, Early Alert and Emergency Alert Systems, Payments and Refunds, some Registration, Prospects, some Human Resources, Transfer Articulation and/or mobile applications. The Learning Management Systems are not expected to be consolidated or replaced at this time.

3. Regarding 4.3 Administrative Systems > Shared Technology Environment; How do you visualize your member colleges and system office sharing the proposed technology?

Response: Please refer to section 4.2 – 4.4 of the RFP. ACCS is interested in how the vendor visualizes the member colleges sharing the proposed technology, services, and business processes. The ACCS is considering creating logical shared operation service centers to support consolidated and standardized business processes. Responses should be made with this in mind.

4. Regarding 6.3.2.2: Position Budgeting and Control > v. Calculating estimate cost of pending or potential retirements (early retirement options for instance); Please describe the cost that is of interest in this requirement and how it relates to position budgeting.

5. On page 71 of the RFP, it says... “Section 4 – Client References - Provide at least five (5) client references that match the System and Colleges’ profiles as closely as possible (see the Section 2: About the System) and have licensed the proposed solution in a comparable environment.” However, Section 2 in the RFP seems to be the Table of Contents. That is, we cannot find a section called “About the System”. So, we believe that the reference to “Section 2: About the System” actually refers to “4: About the Alabama Community College System, Its’ Colleges and Its’ Expectations”. Is that correct? If not, could you point us to the correct section?

Response: The requirement should have referenced Section 4: About the Alabama Community College System, Its’ Colleges and Its’ Expectations
